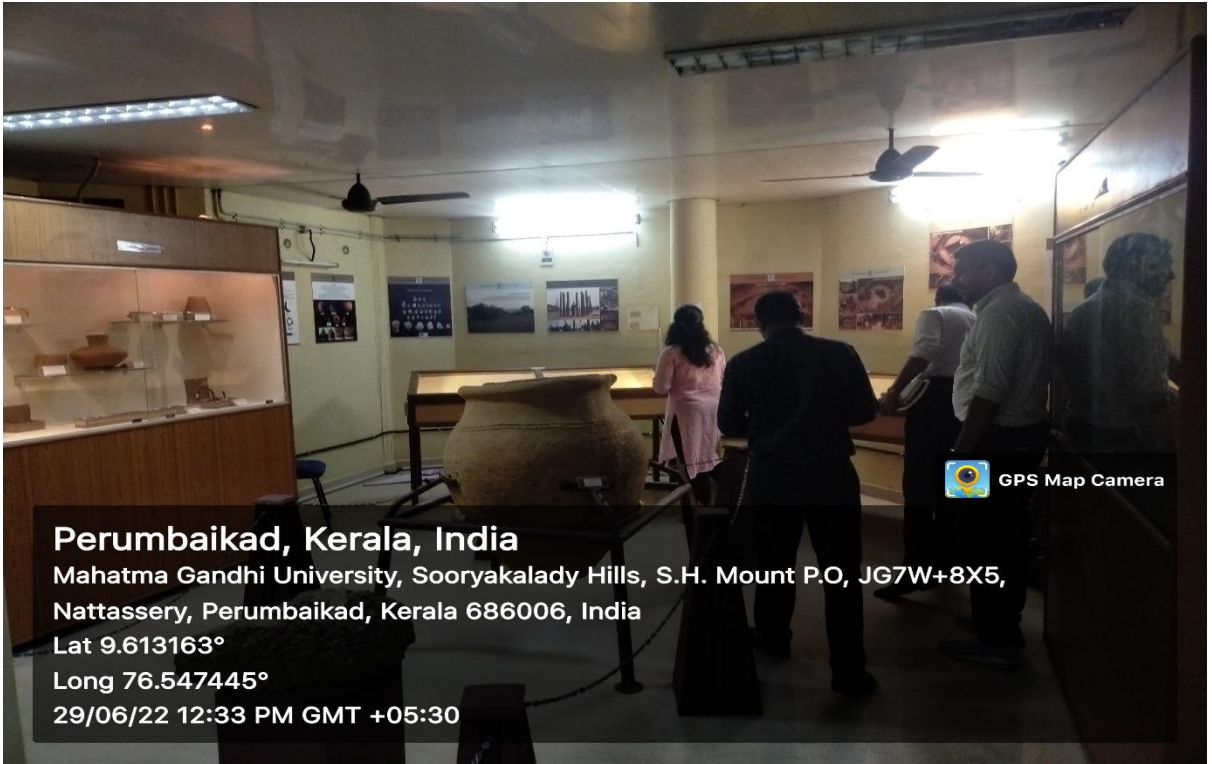

Archaeological Museum

The School of Social Sciences holds the only Archaeological Museum of Mahatma Gandhi University. It has an extensive collection of archaeological remains ranging from Stone Age to early historical and medieval times. A comprehensive collection of stone tools including cleavers, hand-axes, choppers, draggers, cutting tools, chisels and microliths are available. The collection of megalithic pottery from Ambalamedu, Idukki includes various types of masonry, compositions and utilities. The school had conducted an elaborate archaeological excavation at Anakkara, Palakkad during the academic year 2008-09. This excavation conducted jointly by the students and the faculties resulted in the unearthing of different burials including burial urns, megalithic stones, umbrella stones, post holes and fascinating discovery of megalithic quarry. Artefacts collected from these sites forms one category of objects available in the museum. The museum has a separate specimen collection of early historic pottery like NBPW, PGW etc. Significant replicas of Indus relics including Mother Goddess, Dancing Girl, Harappan Man and vital seals like Pashupati, Unicorn and Bull. The in-situ preserved museum also has a detailed collection of early historic age from Pattanam with fragments of beads, wares, tiles, pottery and querns. An ennumable collection of medieval times includes copper-plates, Travancore coins, large collection of unsorted pottery and an enormous cluster of Chinese pottery and ceramics. As an extension activity, School invited students and public to visit our Archaeological Museum. It was conducted as a part of the Social Science Fest, AEONIAN 2022, the school opened the Museum to the public on 25th and 26th of August, 2022. The exhibition was the part of University Open Day with an active participation of visitors with 314 and 335 persons on each day respectively.



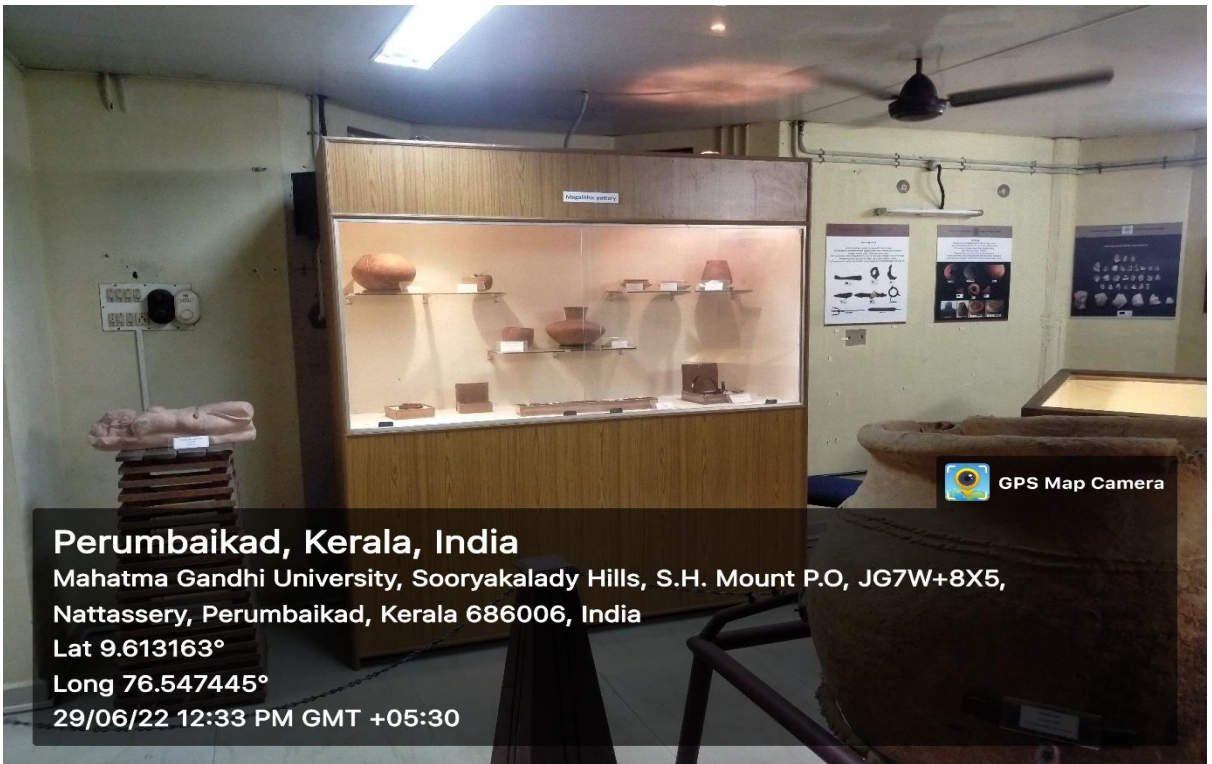



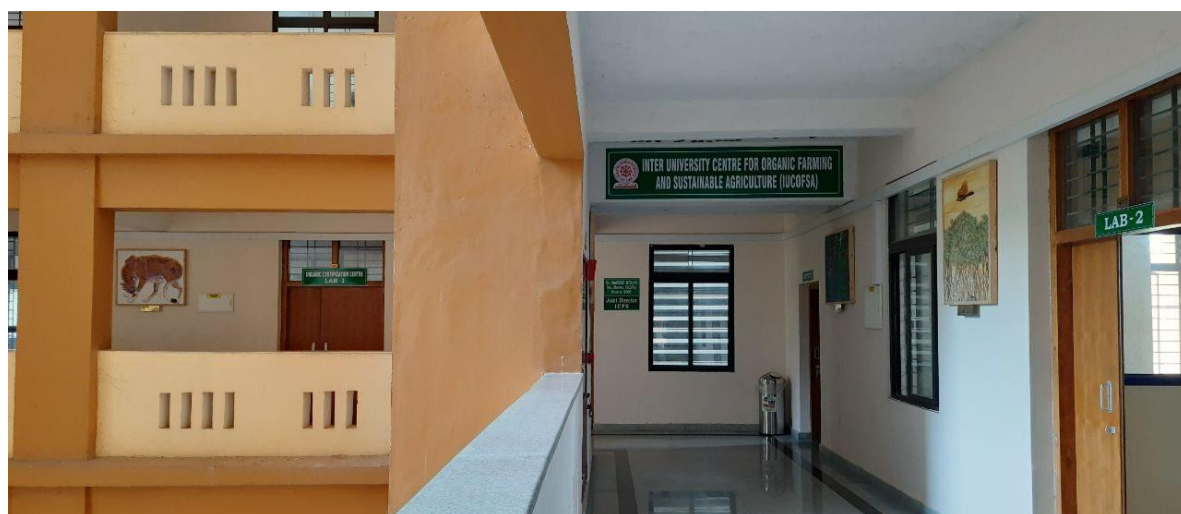

Uyirppu 2018: Reconstruction of Kerala After Floods

The state of Kerala has recently experienced an unprecedented flood disaster, which has caused immense damage throughout the region. It is widely acknowledged that human activity has contributed to the destructive nature of this disaster, and that efforts must be made to mitigate the negative impact of such events. In light of this, the Department of Lifelong Learning and Extension at MG University organized a two-day conference titled 'Uyirpu 2018' on 24th September 2018 at 11.15 am, with the objective of promoting a process of regeneration in harmony with nature. The theme of the conference was 'Reconstruction of Kerala after floods'.

The conference was inaugurated by PK Harikumar, and presided over by Prof. Dr. Sandhya R. S, the Head of the School of Distance Education. The welcome address was given by Smt. Manjusha K. A, the Head of the Department of Life Long Learning and Extension. The gathering was addressed by Prof. Dr. Santosh Thambi, a Syndicate member and the Head of the Department of IUCOFSA. A gift was presented by research students Gopikrishnan from the School of Environment Science, Ajayan Babu from the School of Letters, and Ann Holladay, an American food-life-health expert, along with Syndicate member Adv. PK Harikumar.

The keynote address was delivered by KV Dayal, an organic agriculture campaigner. The experiences of post-flood relief work were shared by research students Gopikrishnan and Ajayan Babu. Gopikrishnan discussed streamlining the department of disaster management, while Ajayan Babu shared his experiences in relief work through his power point presentation, 'back to home after flood'. He emphasized that people from the lower strata of society were greatly affected by the flood and lost their daily jobs after the disaster. He concluded his presentation with the suggestion that Kerala can only be rebuilt through collective efforts. Dayal added that strong youth involvement with strong leadership in positions of power is necessary, along with reshaping the natural ecology through human intervention.

School of Gandhian Thought and development studies is one of renowned department in the university and department offers two unique post graduation programmes ie, M A Gandhian Studies and M A Development studies. Field work and rural camp are the integral part of the curriculum. Department usually conduct seven days of rural camp in any part of Kerala. After the consultation and consideration with THUMPU (NGO), the department reached the stipulation with THAMPU to conduct seven days of rural camp at Attapady in Collaboration with THUMPU, NGO between 21/05/2017-27/05/2017. The department requested to registrar MG University, for the sanction and submitted a detailed proposal of the camp on date 24/04/2017 (No: MISC/SGTDS/2017) to conduct seven days of field work at Attapady in collaboration with THUMPU and DLLE. As a response to this letter Registrar demanded the profile and details of THUMPU NGO, (on the date 04/05/2017, ref No 305/P & D-2/1/2017 governing block) to make sure that THUMPU, works as per the rules and regulations of government. Department submitted the details and profile of THUMPU NGO to registrar, MG University (on the date 11/05/2017). Later department requested to registrar MG University, (on the date 16/05/2017) to grant the fund and to take the necessary procedure to sanction the camp, apart from that the department also informed the registrar that department assigned Manjusha K A, Assistant professor of SGTDS as Camp Director. Along with this request letter department also attached a detailed program schedule, estimate budget and the names of the students who participate in the camp. After the enquiry at Finance/ governing block, department learned that, as per the UGC rules and regulations the fund for conducting rural camp is limited to one lack but the estimate budget of rural camp was two lacks and fifty thousand so the department informed to Registrar, MG University (on the date 19/05/2017) that within this limited fund, conducting seven days of field work is not practical so department reshuffled the camp days and limited.


Diabetic Detection Camp






